National Incident Management System (NIMS) Workshop by Mike Ripley

n May 18, BICEPP sponsored a NIMS workshop in conjunction with the Los Angeles County Office of Emergency Management. The workshop targeted business and public agencies with emergency response and business continuity plans. The workshop stressed the importance of integrating NIMS standards and training into all types of emergency and crisis management planning.

Krys Goethals, Program Manager for the L.A. County Office of Emergency Management, presented the framework and training requirements for NIMS integration. Krys also provided information on NIMS legislation, resource typing, and updates to NIMS standards. A panel consisting of Nancy Mathews of Haley & Aldrich, Steve Goldfarb of USC, and Mike Ripley of NBC Universal provided retrospective on NIMS integration for the private sector. The panel provided basic NIMS and ICS framework for integration into emergency response and continuity plans for business as well as examples for customization of NIMS standards and resource typing for private industry. Participants of the workshop received reference materials and further information on NIMS standards.

Business Continuity Planning – What does that mean?

usiness Continuity Planning is a term popularized over the last two decades and has evolved from planning in the event that there is an earthquake to planning in the event that there is an earth-shattering e-virus. How is the evolution of threats facing business today relevant to your business? How much downtime can you afford on your network? Moreover, how should we be thinking about planning for these threats to our business systems and critical data, and what steps should we be taking to protect ourselves? As my father once told me, "Preparation and planning prevent poor performance."

Business continuity planning is the process whereby businesses ensure the maintenance or recovery of operations, including services to customers, when confronted with adverse events such as natural disasters, technological failures, human error, malicious code, viruses and/or cyber terrorism. The objectives of a business continuity plan (BCP) are to minimize financial loss to the company; continue to serve customers and mitigate the negative effects disruptions can have on a business' strategic plans, reputation, operations, market position, and ability to remain in compliance with applicable laws and regulations. In order to ensure that your business remains healthy through difficult and unforeseen interruption, it is of paramount importance to have robust business continuance plan BCP.

Companies increasingly depend on computer-supported information processing and telecommunications. The increasing dependency on computers and telecommunications for operational support poses the risk that a lengthy loss of these capabilities could seriously affect the overall performance of the company. Information technology and automated information systems are vital elements in most business processes. IT systems are vulnerable to a variety of disruptions, ranging from mild (e.g., short-term power outage, disk drive failure) to severe (e.g., equipment destruction, fire) from a variety of sources such as natural disasters to terrorists actions, and even cyber-crime.

Because these IT resources are so essential to an organization's success, it is critical that the services provided by network systems are able to operate effectively without excessive interruption.
