	 If they are part of a public health investigation If they live or work in high risk settings, such as skilled nursing facilities or homeless shelters If they are a close contact of someone with a confirmed positiv diagnosis of COVID-19, or If they are an essential worker. Prioritization of routine testing among other asymptomatic people is not recommended at this time. COMBATTING HUNGER	 The Los Angeles Regional Food is taking necessary precautions to make sure that food and product remain safe, and that distributions and volunteer activities can continue. For more information <u>Click Here.</u> As of 9/17/20, Access Services has completed over 246,793 meal and grocery deliveries to seniors and people with disabilities across four current projects. This week, #LetsFeedLACounty is hosting 3 drive-thru food distribution events 9/22 Lennox Middle School, 9/23 San Fernando Outdoor Swap Meet and 9/25 Montebollo Mall. Total distributed to date at 33 events is 2,067 tons of food which is the equivalent 3.4 million meals provided to 59,938 households. Drive-thru food distribution event held last week in Long Beach where 2,376 households, respectively, were provided 80 pounds of food, including shelf-stable items, dairy product frozen meat, and fresh produce. Will be expanding to 3 distributions per week starting this week. #LetsFeedLACounty has secured 400 20-pound boxes of groceries from the LA Regional Food Bank for weekly delivery through the end of December to clients of the DHS Housing for Health program. Issuing additional CalFresh benefits up to the maximum allowed per family and allowing CalFresh recipients to purchase groceries online for delivery from Walmart and Amazon. Great Plates Delivered has a current service population: 6,167 seniors (48% increase since from July). Total meals served through this program since May 12: 1,176,837 (122% increase since end of July). The Great Plates Delivered Program has contracted with 64 meal providers are minority-owned businesses. Great Plates Program has been extended until October 9, 2020. Elder Nutrition Program has a current service current population of
	26,919 seniors (37% increase since June 20).
